The Last Week in The Life of Jesus

We've been preaching our way through Matthew's gospel this year. Starting the first Sunday in Lent (March 9) we are going to jump ahead to the last week of Jesus' life which is also called The Passion of Christ. From the triumphant entry into Jerusalem to the cross of Golgotha to the empty garden tomb, the passion of Jesus is the heart of the heart of the gospel.

If you'd like to prepare ahead of time we will do one chapter a week starting with Chapter 21 and concluding with Chapter 28 on Easter Sunday.

It is thrilling, tragic, and ultimately triumphant story in which the Son of God takes on the powers that be and challenges Israel leaders to a show down that he cannot win—at least it appears as if he cannot win. Jesus prophesized that he would be handed over to angry men, be killed, and three days later he would rise from the dead. He was open and honest with his disciples but they could not comprehend it. There is so much in these chapters to teach us how to risk, how to love, and how to live.



And all this takes place within the Christian season we call Lent. Author, Frederick Buechner describes it this way.

"In many cultures there is an ancient custom of giving a tenth of each year's income to some holy use. For Christians, to observe the forty days of Lent is to do the same thing with roughly a tenth of each year's days. After being baptized by John in the river Jordan, Jesus went off alone into the wilderness, where he spent forty days asking himself the question what it meant to be Jesus. During Lent, Christians are supposed to ask one way or another what it means to be themselves."

In other words, it is a season in which we put aside our distractions and obsessions and ask the hard questions of ourselves. We ask God to take us by the hand and show us a better way to live—a better way to be. It is a time that begins by recognizing our own mortality in ashes and repentance and ends with the celebration of Christ's victory over death and the promise that we will join him as resurrected people.

There are a variety of growth opportunities at Carmel UMC this year—above and beyond Sunday morning worship. I am praying at as many of you as possible will take advantage of these experiences. In fact, I believe we are all called to take at least one intentional step forward toward a deeper and richer spiritual life this lent. I look forward to talking with each of you about the wonders, challenges, and God-sightings you experience in the weeks ahead.





WHY Food Pantry Gardens?

Someone once asked me: "Why does CUMC have the Food Pantry Gardens (FPG) when the Food Pantry can probably just buy cheaper produce at local grocery stores?" That question took me aback at first. The answer seemed obvious to me, but maybe it isn't. Here are the many reasons and benefits:

Reason #1: FOOD

The Food Pantry served approximately 4,800 families in 2024. With God's blessings, the FPG grew, harvested, and distributed over 1,100 lbs. of fresh, organically grown, produce to those families. Fresh produce contributes to a healthier diet, but can be expensive and, quite frankly, may be the first food group skipped when a family's funds run low.

Reason #2: FUNDS

The FP was able to spend donated funds to purchase food items other than those 1,100 lbs. of produce.

Reason #3: FELLOWSHIP

Garden Group is an informal gathering of gardeners of all ages, abilities, and experience levels on Thursday evenings from April through October. Volunteers also meet at other times during the week as needed. Participants plant crops, prepare beds, pull weeds, prune plants, perform maintenance, put an end to pests, harvest produce, package and mark produce, and many other pertinent tasks. Not all tasks are labor-intensive; examples are packaging and labeling produce, writing plant tags, and caring for seedlings in the Grow Room and Greenhouse. It's a fun time to fellowship, laugh with each other, learn from each other, plan for the following week, and marvel at God's amazing creation!

Reason #4: EDUCATION

Have you ever made a pole bean teepee, pulled a weed with a foot long root, harvested carrots, or eaten a beet leaf straight from the garden? CUMC Preschool 4-yr old and Pre-K students have done those things and much more. FPG volunteers coordinate with Preschool teachers to expose the students to gardening, introduce them to new plants and foods, and connect them with the FP and practical ways to love our neighbors in need. CUMC Youth and adult leaders also help out whenever asked. Of course, the FPG benefits greatly from all these young hands!

Reason #5: COMMUNITY

We welcome opportunities to engage individuals and groups from our community. A few volunteers have found us because they've walked or biked past the Gardens. Groups like Scouts, Fishers HS, Carmel HS, United Way and others have connected with the FPG during their days of service. Speaking of Scouts, from the installation of the first four raised beds and irrigation system several years ago, to the creation of vegetable beds at the FP building in 2020, to the construction of six more raised beds in 2022, a composting system in 2023, and two cold frames and a greenhouse in 2024, Eagle Scout projects have helped the FPG grow to over 800 sq. ft. of plantable space! In 2025, we look forward to another Eagle Scout project, the construction of two wheelchair-accessible raised beds, and the opportunity to connect with our neighbors at The Restoracy and beyond.

Governing Council Update

February was Missions Pledge Month, <u>but you still have until late March to get your pledges in! Click the link to make your pledge online.</u>

Thank you for your ongoing, generous support of our missions and ministries at Carmel United Methodist Church. Without your service and your gifts, we could never fully live out the example of Jesus Christ to our neighbors in Hamilton County and across the globe.

Our Governing Council and Finance Committee want to keep the congregation informed about the 2024 year-end financials for our church, our pledge drive totals, and the resulting church budget for 2025, which was approved in late January.

This past fall, 169 church families or "giving units" pledged a total of nearly \$950,000 to support the continued operation of our church.

We started the 2024 budget with a deficit of \$280,000 and ended the year with a surplus of \$42,000. How did that happen? First, our church staff did a great job of managing and staying within their budgets. It was also accomplished through your increased giving, both in 2024 and carried over from late 2023.

Looking ahead to 2025, we're starting with a similar deficit as 2024 of just under \$282,000 – planning with the faith that God will provide. Your pledges, combined with the other expected sources of revenue as shown here, total just over \$1.4 million. Budget expenses total just under \$1.7 million.

There are so many vital things funded from our operations budget:

• It keeps our church doors safely open by paying for utilities, insurance, security, and building and grounds maintenance, which as you may see at home has increased in cost in recent years.

 Printing and postage to stay in touch with you through Sunday worship bulletins and mailers, especially for those who are not smartphone and computer users

• Any time you see our amazing staff making Disciples and making a difference, you made that happen through your support of their salaries!

• In addition to our worship services and their inspiring music, the budget funds events that bring our church community together including Vacation Bible School, Fall Kickoff, youth retreats and monthly Traditional Music Ministry programs among many, many others.

There are other ways that you contribute to the larger financial picture:

- Celebrating and remembering family and friends on Sundays through donut and altar flower donations
- Purchasing Christmas trees and porch pots to support our youth programs
- Enrolling your children and grandchildren in our preschool, which contributes to the church budget
- And your service and donations that help offset paid expenses



Building Trust: 2021 Year in Review

With our upcoming 2025 Capital Campaign, the Building Trustees wanted to communicate in this issue and upcoming Contacts, a summary of major projects for last four years and an accounting of fund sources used.

In 2021, we completed the first of four planned phases with our Sanctuary Roof replacement. Besides the replacing the roof with Owens **Corning Duration** components, the ventilation system was updated and the large box gutter sealed. The total cost of \$54,882 was funded by our capital account.





Additionally, we replaced a deteriorated garage roof at the same time for \$7010.

Also in 2021, we completed the first phase of parking lot replacement (Door 3 Southwest) to address poor drainage and slip risk. The total cost of \$48,413 was funded by our capital account.









Inside the church in 2021 following a lightning power surge, the entire fire system was replaced by our insurance company claim for \$57,087.



The main kitchen heating and cooling system was replaced with a Trane mini-split and WiFi thermostat for \$10,986. The circulating pump for our boiler hot water system to the main level north wing zone was



replaced for \$4082. Both HVAC replacements were covered by our heating and cooling yearly operating budget.

In keeping up our beautiful campus landscaping, the over grown shrubs on 126th Street were replaced with slower growing shorter viburnum for \$4946. Additional tree work to remove and replace failing trees cost \$4480.


In summary in 2021, Carmel United Methodist Church spent \$214,000 with funds coming primarily from our capital account and smaller amounts from our building heating operating budget, an insurance claim and Rushlight Greatest Needs and Maintenance Endowments.

Building Trust: 2022 Year in Review

In the Summer 2022, we completed the second phase of four planned phases with the replacement of the complex North Wing Roof with active ventilation and gutter replacement. After competitive bidding




and specifying Owens Corning materials and long term warranty, this phase cost \$85,773.





level pit addressed. The total cost of this project was \$107,796 was covered by our capital account.



motion or timers. After Duke Energy rebates, the total cost was \$14,821 and covered by our capital account and Duke prescriptive rebates.







Led by many church members, all of our interior lights were upgraded to energy saving LEDs. The cost of for the energy saving light investment less Duke rebates was \$26,317 and covered by Rushlight Greatest Needs and the Maintenance Endowment fund sources. Payback in lower electricity costs was achieved within two years.

Our last project transformed our Rangeline entrance in time for Christmas 2022. Thanks to one of our building trustees, a perfect antique chandelier replacement was



found and new **LED**



canopy lights installed to provide a Christmas glow. Total cost of \$3000 was funded by Rushlight Greatest Needs and a matching grant from the

United Methodist Foundation of Indiana.

So in 2022, Carmel United Methodist Church invested \$248,359 in building projects with funds coming primarily from capital projects with smaller amounts from maintenance endowment, UMF grant and Rushlight Greatest Needs.

Next month, your Building Trustees will report on 2023 and 2024 Projects and fund sources.
